SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 06.08.2008

RAINFALL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

ANDHRA PRADESH

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **06 human deaths** have been reported in the State.
- About **4071 people** in **05 districts** have been severally affected.
- In **06 relief camps**, **4071 people** have been accommodated.
- **River Godavari** is reported to be in rising trend in the State.

UTTAR PRADESH

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **03 human deaths** have been reported by the State.
- **In 11 districts, 14,82718 people** have been affected in the State.
- **In 250 relief camps, 9190 people** have been accommodated.
- About **4249 people** from the affected areas have been evacuated so far.
- **1452 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the affected areas.
- **115 mobile teams** of doctors along with medicines have been deployed in the flood affected areas for providing medical care.
- **River Ghaghra** continued to be flowing above its danger levels at **Elgin Bridge & Turtipar**.

BIHAR

- **Light rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- About **4,29,000 people** in **09 districts** have been severally affected due to flood in the State.
- **604 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **In 05 relief camps, 2792 people** have been accommodated.
- **River Ganga, Burhi Gandak and Kosi** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

ASSAM

- **Moderate to heavy rainfall** with isolated **extremely heavy falls** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **4.93 lakh people** are reported to have been affected in the State due to flood so far.
- **In, 22 relief camps, 15,865 people** have been accommodated.
- **04 teams** of **NDRF** continued to be deployed in the State.
- River **Brahmaputra, Katakhal, Kushiya** and **Dhansiri (S)** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

WEST BENGAL

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in a few parts of the State.
- **03 human death** has been reported in the State.
- About **37.06 lakh people** are reported to have been affected in the State

due to flood so far.

- **61692 people** continue to stay in **138 relief camps**.
- **199 Medical teams** continued to be deployed in the affected areas for providing medical care.
- **River Ganga** is still flowing above its danger level at **Farakka**.

Human deaths

- As per provisional information received from the affected States/UTs, **13 human deaths (Andhra Pradesh-06, Uttar Pradesh & West Bengal – 03 each and Kerala-01)** were reported during last **24 hours**, raising the total death toll to **998** from **985**.

IMD

- Yesterday's low pressure area over **south Chhattisgarh** and neighbourhood has become less marked.
- The monsoon trough at sea level passes through **Anupgarh, Pilani, Agra, Fatehpur, Hazaribag, Balasore** and thence southeastward to eastcentral **Bay of Bengal** with embedded cyclonic circulation over **Haryana & neighbourhood** and another over **Jharkhand & neighbourhood**

CWC

- There are **14 Moderate** and **25 Low flood situation sites** in the country.

INDIA METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT

Chief features

- Yesterday's low pressure area over **south Chhattisgarh** and neighbourhood has become less marked.
- The monsoon trough at sea level passes through **Anupgarh, Pilani, Agra, Fatehpur, Hazaribag, Balasore** and thence southeastward to eastcentral **Bay of Bengal** with embedded cyclonic circulation over **Haryana & neighbourhood** and another over **Jharkhand & neighbourhood**
- The off shore trough from **Maharashtra** coast to **Kerala** coast persists. It is likely to cause fairly widespread rainfall activity along the west coast.

Warning

- **Isolated heavy rainfall** is likely over **Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Sikkim, Konkan, Goa and northeastern**.

Outlook for next two days

- **A fresh low pressure area** is likely to form over **northwest** and adjoining **west central Bay of Bengal** around **9th August**.
- With likely formation of vortex over **Gujarat & neighbourhood** and increase along the **west coast** and **Gujarat** state with possibility of very heavy rainfall from **9th August**.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION

According to the **Central Water Commission (CWC)** report dated **6th August, 2008**, there are **14 Moderate** and **25 Low flood situation sites**. The details of Moderate Flood Sites are as under:

- **River Brahmaputra** at **Dibrugarh** is flowing at **105.14m** against the **danger level** of **104.24m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Dhansiri(s)** at **Numaligarh** is flowing at **78.23m** against the **danger level** of **77.42m** with a **falling trend**.

- **River Jiabharali at Jiabharali (NTX)** is flowing at **77.00m** against the **danger level of 77.00m** with a **steady trend**.
- **River Barak at APGhat** is flowing at **19.84m** against the **danger level of 19.83m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Kushiyara at Karimganj** is flowing at **15.66m** against the **danger level of 14.94m** with a **rising trend**

Bihar

- **River Ganga at Colgaon** is flowing at **31.28m** against the **danger level of 31.09m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Burhi Gandak at Rosera** is flowing at **42.81m** against the **danger level of 42.63m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Burhi Gandak at Khagaria** is flowing at **36.99m** against the **danger level of 36.58m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Kosi at Kursela** is flowing at **30.45m** against the **danger level of 30.00m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Kosi at Basua** is flowing at **48.00m** against the **danger level of 47.75m** with a **falling trend**.

Uttar Pradesh

- **River Ghaghra at Elgin Bridge** is flowing at **106.13m** against the **danger level of 106.07m** with a **steady trend**.
- **River Ghaghra at Turtipar** is flowing at **64.13m** against the **danger level of 64.01m** with a **falling trend**.

Jharkhand

- **River Ganga at Sahibganj** is flowing at **27.90m** against the **danger level of 27.25m** with a **falling trend**.

West Bengal

- **River Ganga at Farakka** is flowing at **22.90m** against the **danger level of 22.25m** with a **steady trend**.

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **06 human deaths** have been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- About **4071 people** in **05 districts (Adilabad, Warangal, Khammam, East Godavari and West Godavari)** have been severally affected.
- **06 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected areas in which **4071 people** have been accommodated.
- A few boats are reported to have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **River Godavari** is reported to be in rising trend in the State.

UTTAR PRADESH

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **03 human deaths** have been reported by the State.
- **14,82718 people** have been affected in **11 districts** in the State so far due to flood.
- **3226 villages** have been affected severally in the State.
- **250 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected areas in which **9190 people** have been accommodated.

- **17413 houses (1790 fully and 17288 partially)** have been damaged so far.
- About **4249 people** from the affected areas have been evacuated so far.
- **1452 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the affected areas.
- **115 mobile teams** of doctors along with medicines have been deployed in the flood affected areas for providing medical care.
- **775 cattle** have been treated and **70775 cattle** were vaccinated so far.
- **17** companies of **PAC** have been deployed with **184** motorized boats and **88** wooden boats in the affected areas for relief and rescue operations.
- **River Ghaghra** continued to be flowing above its danger levels at **Elgin Bridge & Turtipar**.

BIHAR

- **Light rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- About **4,29,000 people** from **729 villages** in **09 districts (Muzaffarpur, Supaul, Patna, Katihar, Nalanda, Araria, West Champaran, Saharsa and Khagaria)** have been severally affected due to flood in the State.
- **1755 houses** are reported to have been damaged due to flood so far.
- **604 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **05 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected area in which **2792** people have been accommodated.
- **River Ganga, Burhi Gandak and Kosi** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

ASSAM

- **Moderate to heavy rainfall** with isolated **extremely heavy falls** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- **4.93 lakh people** are reported to have been affected in the State due to flood so far.
- **15,865 people** continue to stay in **22 relief camps** in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **04 teams** of **NDRF** continued to be deployed in the State.
- River **Brahmaputra, Katakhal, Kushiya and Dhansiri (S)** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

WEST BENGAL

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in a few parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **03 human death** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- About **37.06 lakh people** are reported to have been affected in the State due to flood so far.
- **61692 people** continue to stay in **138 relief camps**.
- **199 Medical teams** continued to be deployed in the affected areas for providing medical care.
- **398395 houses (238569 fully and 159826 partially)** are reported to have been damaged due to flood so far.
- **River Ganga** is still flowing above its danger level at **Farakka**.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 6th AUGUST, 2008

- ❖ **In Assam, 01 team** (about 40 personnel) deployed at **Dhakuakhana** with **OBM** plus Boats assault universal type carrying out flood rescue operations. **03 teams** (about **120 personnel**) have been kept on standby at **BTC Hailakandi, Dhemaji** and **Dhubri** for monsoon emergency response.
- ❖ **In Jammu & Kashmir, 01 team** consisting of **45 personnel** continued to be deployed for **Amaranth Yatra**.
- ❖ **In Uttaranchal, 01 team** consisting of **45 personnel** continued to be deployed for **Kailash Mansarovar Yatra** route at **Pithoragarh** district.
