SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 11.08.2008

RAINFALL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

GUJARAT

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **extremely heavy falls** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **02 human deaths** have been reported by the State.

KARNATAKA

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **extremely heavy falls** has been reported in a few parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.

ORISSA

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **extremely heavy falls** has been reported in various parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.

MAHARASHTRA

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **extremely heavy falls** has been reported in most parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- Due to heavy rainfall, train services between Mumbai and Pune have been disrupted and routes of other several trains have been diverted.
- **01 team** consisting of **32 personnel** has been deployed in **Pune** for flood water rescue operation.

ANDHRA PRADESH

- **Heavy to very heavy** with **isolated extremely heavy falls** has been reported in several parts of the State.
- **37 human deaths** occurred during last few days have been reported by the State today.
- About **13061 people** in **05 districts** have been severally affected.
- **In 136 relief camps**, about **38,243 people** have been accommodated.
- **48 medical camps** have been established for providing medical care to the affected people.
- **06th NDRF Bn** at **Arakanam** has been alerted to keep the SAR teams ready for move on short notice for rescue and relief operations

UTTAR PRADESH

- **Light rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **14 human deaths** have been reported by the State during **last 24 hours**.
- In all, **11,62,122 people** have been affected in **11 districts** in the State.
- **3236 villages** have been affected severally and **674 villages** have been marooned in the State.
- **294 cattle/livestock** are reported to have been perished.
- **In 241 relief camps**, about **8875 people** have been accommodated.
- **1192 boats** and **116 mobile teams** of doctors along with medicines have

been deployed in the State.

BIHAR

- **Light rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **01 human death** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- In all, about **6,12,000 people** from **789 villages** have been severally affected in the State.
- **In 05 relief camps**, about **2792** people have been accommodated.

ASSAM

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in the State.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- About **4.93 lakh people**, in all, are reported to have been affected in the State.
- **15,865 people** continued to be accommodated in **22 relief camps** in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **04 teams** of **NDRF** continued to be deployed in the State.
- River **Brahmaputra** and **Dhansiri (S)** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

WEST BENGAL

- **Light rainfall** has been reported in a few parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- About **37.06 lakh people**, in all, are reported to have been affected in the State.
- **17300 people** continued to be accommodated in **81 relief camps** in the State.

Human deaths

- As per provisional information received from the affected States/UTs, **56 human deaths (Andhra Pradesh-37, Uttar Pradesh-14, Rajasthan & Gujarat-02 each and Bihar-01)** (some deaths occurred earlier but reported today) were reported during last **24 hours**, raising the total death toll to **1119** from **1063**.

IMD

- **Yesterdays' depression over north interior Orissa weakened** into a well marked **low pressure area** at 1730 hours IST of **10th August, 2008** and lay over **north Orissa** and neighbourhood. Now it lies as **low pressure area** over **East Madhya Pradesh** and neighbourhood. Under its influence, **fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is likely over **East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha and Chhattisgarh** during next **24 hours** and over **Madhya Maharashtra, Konkan Goa and West Madhya Pradesh** during next **24 hours**. **The rainfall belt** is likely to extend into **Gujarat and Rajasthan from tomorrow onwards**.
- **Widespread rainfall over northeastern States** and adjoining **east India** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** during next **3-4 days**.

CWC

- There are **14 Moderate** and **24 Low flood situation sites** in the country.

INDIA METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT

Chief features

- **Yesterdays' depression over north interior Orissa weakened** into a well marked **low pressure area** at 1730 hours IST of **10th August, 2008** and lay over **north Orissa** and neighbourhood. Now it lies as **low pressure area** over

East Madhya Pradesh and neighbourhood. Under its influence, **fairly widespread rainfall** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is likely over **East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha and Chhattisgarh** during next **24 hours** and over **Madhya Maharashtra, Konkan Goa and West Madhya Pradesh** during next **24 hours**. The **rainfall belt** is likely to extend into **Gujarat and Rajasthan from tomorrow onwards**.

- The axis of monsoon trough at sea level passes through **Phalodi, Ambikapur, Balasore** and thence **southeastwards to east central Bay of Bengal**.
- The off shore trough from **Maharashtra** coast to **Kerala** coast persists. It is likely to cause **fairly widespread rainfall** activity along the **west coast**.
- **Widespread rainfall** over **northeastern States** and adjoining **east India** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** during next **3-4 days**.

Warning

- **Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall** is likely over **East Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Vidarbha** during next **24 hours**.
- **Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall** is likely over **northeastern states, Gujarat, West Madhya Pradesh, Konkan, Goa, Madhya Maharashtra and Coastal Karnataka** during next **48 hours**.

Outlook for next two days

- **Fairly widespread rainfall** activity is likely over **Indo Gangetic Plains and northeastern states**.
- **Subdued rainfall** activity is likely over **Peninsular India**.

- **River Ghaghra at Turtipar** is flowing at **64.08m** against the **danger level of 64.01m** with a **steady trend**.
- **River Ghaghra at Ayodhya** is flowing at **93.02m** against the **danger level of 92.73m** with a **steady trend**.

Jharkhand

- **River Ganga at Sahibganj** is flowing at **27.79m** against the **danger level of 27.25m** with a **steady trend**.

West Bengal

- **River Ganga at Farakka** is flowing at **22.70m** against the **danger level of 22.25m** with a **steady trend**.

Delhi

- **River Yamuna at Delhi Rly Bridge** is flowing at **204.93m** against the **danger level of 204.83m** with a **rising trend**.

GUJARAT

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy falls** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**. Areas where significant rainfall occurred are (in cm): **Kaprada-31.5, Gandevi-30.6, Jalalpor-26.2, Dharampur-24.5, Chikhli-17.8, Umernagar-15.7, Pardi-14.7, Valsad-12.7, Vansda-11.6, Navsari-10.7 and Bardoli-10.0**.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.

KARNATAKA

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy falls** has been reported in a few parts of the State during last **24 hours**. Areas where significant rainfall occurred are (in cm) :**Yellapura-14.0, Sringeri, Kottigehra, Kammardi & Ankola-13.0, Dharmasthala & Joida-11.0** each, **Mani-10.0** and **Udupi, Gerusoppa & Karwar-9.0** each.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.

ORISSA

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy falls** has been reported in various parts of the State during last **24 hours**. Areas where significant rainfall occurred are (in cm): **Nawarangpur-15.0, Koraput & Gunpur-12.0** each, **Junagarh & Kosagumda-11.0** each, **Parlakhemundi & Jaipatna-9.0** each and **Jaipatna & Mohana-7.0** each.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.

MAHARASHTRA

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall with extremely heavy falls** has been reported in most parts of the State during **last 24 hours**. Areas where significant rainfall occurred are (in cm): **Mahabaleshwar-44.0, Gaganbavda-36.0, Poladpur-27.0, Radhanagari-20.0, Chandgad-14.0, Ratnagiri & Mulsi-12.0** each, **Ajra & Bhudargad-11.0, Amgaon-10.0, Naigaon & Shahuwadi-9.0, Panhala-8.0** and **Igatpuri & Trimbak-7.0** each.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- Due to heavy rainfall, train services between Mumbai and Pune have been disrupted and routes of other several trains have been diverted.
- **01 team** consisting of **32 personnel** has been deployed in **Pune** for flood water rescue operation.

ANDHRA PRADESH

- **Heavy to very heavy with isolated extremely heavy falls** has been reported in several parts of the State during last **24 hours**. **Nuzvid-17.0, Banswada & Medak-15.0** each, **Jangaon, Mahabubabad & Tiruvuru-13.0** each, **Eluru, Hakimpet, Kamareddy, Khammam, Navipet & Paleru Bridge-12.0** each, **Amalapuram, Chintalapudi, Koyyalagudem & Prakasam Barrage-11.0** each, **Hyderabad & Tanuku-10.0** each and **Guntur-9.0**.
- **37 human deaths** occurred during last few days have been reported by the State today.
- About **13061 people** in **05 districts (Adilabad, Vizianagaram, Hyderabad, East Godavari and Krishna)** have been severally affected.
- **136 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected areas in which about **38,243 people** have been accommodated.
- **48 medical camps** have been established for providing medical care to the affected people.
- **12355** houses are reported to have been damaged so far.
- Several roads and crop areas are reported to have been damaged.
- **06th NDRF Bn at Arakanam** has been alerted to keep the SAR teams ready for move on short notice for rescue and relief operations

UTTAR PRADESH

- **Light to Moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **14 human deaths** have been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- In all, **11,62,122 people** have been affected in **11 districts** in the State so far due to flood.
- **3236 villages** have been affected severally and **674 villages** have been marooned in the State.
- **23172 houses (1963 fully and 21209 partially)** have been damaged so far.
- About **4272 people** from the affected areas have been evacuated so far.
- **294 cattle/livestock** are reported to have been perished.
- **241 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected areas in which **8875 people** have been accommodated.
- **1192 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the affected areas.
- **116 mobile teams** of doctors along with medicines have been deployed in the flood affected areas for providing medical care.
- **775 cattle** have been treated and **70775 cattle** were vaccinated so far.
- **17 companies of PAC** have been deployed with **184** motorized boats and **88** wooden boats in the affected areas for relief and rescue operations.
- **River Ghaghra** is flowing above its danger level at **Elgin Bridge, Ayodhya & Turtipar** in the State.

BIHAR

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **01 human death** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- In all, about **6,12,000 people** from **789 villages** in **10 districts (Muzaffarpur, Supaul, Patna, Katihar, Nalanda, Araria, West Champaran, Shekhpura, Saharsa and Khagaria)** have been severally affected due to flood in the State.

- **1874 houses** are reported to have been damaged due to flood so far.
- **701 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **50911 persons** have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
- **05 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected area in which **2792** people have been accommodated.
- **River Ganga, Bagmati, Burhi Gandak** and **Kosi** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

- ❖ **In Jammu & Kashmir, 01 team** consisting of **45 personnel** continued to be deployed for **Amaranth Yatra**.
- ❖ **In Uttaranchal, 01 team** consisting of **45 personnel** continued to be deployed for **Kailash Mansarovar Yatra** route at **Pithoragarh** district.
- ❖ **In Andhra Pradesh, 06th NDRF Bn** at **Arakanam** has been alerted to keep the SAR teams ready for move on short notice for rescue and relief operations.
- ❖ **In Rajasthan, 01 team** consisting of **70 personnel** has been deployed at **Gaparnath Cave in Kota** for rescue operation.

- ❖ **In Maharashtra, 01 team** consisting of **32 personnel** has been deployed at **Pune** for flood water rescue operation.
