**SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 18.08.2008**

**RAINFALL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY**

**PUNJAB**

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **18 Human deaths** have been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- Due to heavy rainfall, **Ropar, Jalandhar, Moga, Kapurthala, Tarantaran & Ferozepur** districts have been flooded and about **37903 people** from **244 villages** in above districts are reported to have been affected severely.
- **23 cattle and 11700 hens** have been perished and **50655** ha cropped area has been damaged.
- **09 boats** and **03 medical teams** have been deployed in the flood affected areas.
- **11 relief camps** have been opened in the affected areas
- Train, road communications, power and water supply have also been affected in **Ropar, Jalandhar, Moga, Kapurthala, Tarantaran & Ferozepur** districts.
- **10 Army columns** with **10 Engineer Task forces** have been deployed in the flood affected areas for rescue and relief operations

**DELHI**

- **Light rainfall** has been reported in **Delhi** and **NCR** during last **24 hours**
- **No human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- **River Yamuna** continued to be flowing above its danger level with rising trend at **Delhi Old Railway Bridge**.

**HARYANA**

- **Moderate to heavy rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State during last 24 hours.
- **02 Human deaths** have been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- Due to heavy rainfall, **Jhajjar, Rohtak and Bhiwani** districts have been flooded.
- About **19700 people** from **126 villages** are reported to have been affected severely.
- **176 medical teams** have been deployed in the flood affected areas.

**KARNATAKA**

- **Light to moderate rainfall** with **isolated heavy falls** has been reported in South Interior and Coastal parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- **154 villages** in **05 districts** have been affected severally due to flood.
- **In 44 relief camps** about **5978 people** have been accommodated.

### ANDHRA PRADESH

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **isolated heavy falls** has been reported in the State.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- About **253586 people** in **05 districts** have been severally affected.
- **In 51 relief camps** about **19631 people** have been accommodated.
- **405 medical camps** have been established in the affected people.
- **06<sup>th</sup> NDRF Bn** at **Arakanam** has been alerted to keep the SAR teams ready for move on short notice for rescue and relief operations.

### MAHARASHTRA

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- **Total 1976 village in 06 districts** have been affected severely.
- **02 teams** consisting of **64 personnel** continued to be deployed at **Chandrapur** and **Kolhapur** district for flood water rescue operation.

### UTTAR PRADESH

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **isolated extremely falls** has been reported in most parts of the State.
- **73 human deaths** occurred earlier in the State but reported today.
- In all, **15,13,342 people** have been affected in **11 districts** in the State so far due to flood.
- **3239 villages** have been affected. **674 villages** have been marooned in the State.
- **In 252 relief camps**, about **10029 people** continued to be accommodated.
- **2047 boats** and **116 mobile teams** of doctors along with medicines have been deployed in the flood affected areas.

### BIHAR

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with isolated heavy falls has been reported in most parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- In all, about **6,14,000 people** from **802 villages** in **10 districts** have been severally affected due to flood in the State.
- **1893 houses** are reported to have been damaged due to flood so far.
- **734 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **In 05 relief camps** about **2792** people continued to be accommodated.

### ASSAM

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with isolated extremely heavy falls has been reported in the State.
- **No human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- **About 4.93 lakh people**, in all, are reported to have been affected in the State due to flood so far.
- **15,865 people** continued to be accommodated in **22 relief camps**.
- **04 teams** of **NDRF** continued to be deployed in the State.

### WEST BENGAL

- **Light rainfall** has been reported in a few parts of the State.
- **02 human deaths** have been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.

- About **37.06 lakh people**, in all, are reported to have been affected.
- **150 people** continued to be accommodated in **05 relief camps** in the State.
- **199 Medical teams** and **02 boats** continued to be deployed in the affected areas of the State.

#### Human deaths

- As per provisional information received from the affected States/UTs, **103 human deaths** were reported during last **24 hours**, raising the total death toll to **1385** from **1282**.

#### IMD

- **Yesterday's upper air cyclonic circulation** over **East Uttar Pradesh** and **neighbourhood** extending upto **4.5 km** above sea level persists.
- Under this scenario, **fairly widespread rainfall** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is likely over **northeastern States, Sub Himalayan West Bengal, Sikkim** and **Gangetic Plains** during next **2-3 days**.

#### CWC

- There are **24 Moderate** and **25 Low flood situation sites** in the country.

### INDIA METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT

#### Chief features

- **Yesterday's upper air cyclonic circulation** over **East Uttar Pradesh** and **neighbourhood** extending upto **4.5 km** above sea level persists.
- The western end of monsoon trough runs close to foot hills of the Himalayas. However, its eastern end passes through **Hardoi, Motihari, Malda** and thence **southeastwards to northeast Bay of Bengal**.
- Under this scenario, **fairly widespread rainfall** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is likely over **northeastern States, Sub Himalayan West Bengal, Sikkim** and **Gangetic Plains** during next **2-3 days**.

#### Warning

- **Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall** is likely over **northeastern States, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh** and **Bihar**.

#### Outlook for next two days

- **Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall** activity is likely over parts of **northwest India and Rajasthan**.
- **Subdued rainfall** activity is likely over **Peninsular** and **adjoining central India**.

### CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION

### Bihar

- **River Ganga** at **Patna** is flowing at **49.25m** against the **danger level** of **48.60m** with a **steady trend**.
- **River Ganga** at **Colgong** is flowing at **31.80m** against the **danger level** of **31.09m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Ganga** at **Hathidah** is flowing at **42.26m** against the **danger level** of **41.76m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Ghaghra** at **Darauli** is flowing at **60.89m** against the **danger level** of **60.82m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Ghaghra** at **Gangpur Siswan** is flowing at **57.23m** against the **danger level** of **57.04m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Burhi Gandak** at **Khagaria** is flowing at **37.30m** against the **danger level** of **36.58m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Bagmati** at **Benibad** is flowing at **48.96m** against the **danger level** of **48.68m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Kosi** at **Basua** is flowing at **48.00m** against the **danger level** of **47.75m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Kosi** at **Kursela** is flowing at **30.96m** against the **danger level** of **30.00m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Mahananda** at **Dhengraghat** is flowing at **36.36m** against the **danger level** of **35.65m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Mahananda** at **Jhawa** is flowing at **31.95m** against the **danger level** of **31.40m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Pun Pun** at **Sripalpur** is flowing at **52.76m** against the **danger level** of **50.60m** with a **rising trend**.

### Uttar Pradesh

- **River Ganga** at **Balia** is flowing at **58.23m** against the **danger level** of **57.62m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Ghaghra** at **Elgin Bridge** is flowing at **106.46m** against the **danger level** of **106.07m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Ghaghra** at **Turtipar** is flowing at **64.30m** against the **danger level** of **64.01m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Ghaghra** at **Ayodhya** is flowing at **93.20m** against the **danger level** of **92.73m** with a **rising trend**.

### Jharkhand

- **River Ganga** at **Sahibganj** is flowing at **28.28m** against the **danger level** of **27.25m** with a **rising trend**.

### West Bengal

- **River Ganga** at **Farakka** is flowing at **23.20m** against the **danger level** of **22.25m** with a **rising trend**.

## Delhi

- **River Yamuna at Delhi Rly Bridge** is flowing at **205.64m** against the **danger level** of **204.83m** with a **rising trend**.

### PUNJAB

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **18 Human deaths** have been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- Due to heavy rainfall, **Ropar, Jalandhar, Moga, Kapurthala, Tarantaran & Ferozepur** districts have been flooded and about **37903 people** from **244 villages** in above districts are reported to have been affected severely.
- **36150 people** have been evacuated in **Ferozpur, Hoshiarpur, Jalandhar, Ropar** and **Moga districts** so far.
- **23 cattle and 11700 hens** have been perished.
- **50655** ha cropped area has been damaged.
- **09 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations.
- **11 relief camps** have been opened in the affected areas
- **03 medical teams** have been deployed in the flood affected areas.
- **902 houses (525-fully and 377-partially)** have been damaged so far.
- Train and road communications have also been affected in **Ropar, Jalandhar, Moga, Kapurthala, Tarantaran & Ferozepur** districts.
- Power and water supply has also been badly affected in affected districts.
- **10 Army columns** (consisting of 120 personnel in each column) with **10 Engineer Task forces** (consisting of 12 personnel in each ETF) have been deployed in **Jalandhar, Firozpur and Kapurthala** for rescue and relief operations

### DELHI

- **Light rainfall** has been reported in **Delhi** and **NCR**.
- **River Yamuna** is flowing above its danger levels at **Delhi Old railway bridge**.
- Several jhuggies in the catchment area of Yamuna in Usmanpur, East Delhi have been submerged under water.
- People residing in the riverbank/floodplains areas were asked to vacate their houses in view of rising water of Yamuna.
- As a precautionary measure, the administration has evacuated few people residing on the riverbanks near **Usmanpur** and **Burari**.
- **River Yamuna** continued to be flowing above its danger level with rising trend at **Delhi Old Railway Bridge**.

### HARYANA

- **Moderate to heavy rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **02 Human deaths** have been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- Due to heavy rainfall, **Jhajjar, Rohtak and Bhiwani districts** have been flooded.
- About **19700 people** from **126 villages** are reported to have been affected severely.
- **176 medical teams** have been deployed in the flood affected areas.
- **306 houses (36-fully and 270-partially)** have been damaged so far.

- A few pumps have been installed in the Bhiwani district for dewatering the water.

### **KARNATAKA**

- **Light to moderate rainfall** with **isolated heavy falls** has been reported in South Interior and Coastal parts of the State during **last 24 hours**.
- **No human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- **154 villages** in **05 districts (Belgaum, Uttara Kannada, Shimoga, Kodagu & Udupi)** have been affected severally due to flood so far.
- **2589 houses (259 fully and 2330 partially)** have been damaged so far.
- **166 cattle/livestock** are reported to have been perished.
- **44 relief camps** opened in the affected areas in which about **5978 people** have been accommodated.
- **6 boats** have been pressed into service in the affected areas for rescue and relief operations.

### **ANDHRA PRADESH**

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **isolated heavy falls** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- About **253586 people** in **05 districts (Adilabad, Vizianagaram, Hyderabad, East Godavari and Krishna)** have been severally affected.
- **51 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected areas in which about **19631 people** have been accommodated.
- **405 medical camps** have been established for providing medical care to the affected people.
- **44321 houses** are reported to have been damaged so far.
- Several roads and crop areas are reported to have been damaged.
- **06<sup>th</sup> NDRF Bn** at **Arakanam** has been alerted to keep the SAR teams ready for move on short notice for rescue and relief operations.

### **MAHARASHTRA**

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State during **last 24 hours**.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- **Total 1976 village in 06 districts (Pune, Kolhapur, Raigad, Ratnagiri, Sindhudurg and Thane)** have been affected severely due heavy rainfall.
- Following improvement in the flood situation, relief camps running in the State have been closed.
- **02 teams** consisting of **64 personnel** continued to be deployed at **Chandrapur** and **Kolhapur** district for flood water rescue operation.

### **UTTAR PRADESH**

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **isolated extremely falls** has been reported in most parts of the State during **last 24 hours**. Areas where significant rainfall occurred are (in cm): **Kanpur-13.0, Mahoba, Auraiya, Dabri, Shahjina-10.0 each, Bareilly-7.0, Shahjhanpur-6.0 and Fatehgarh & Narora-5.0 each**.
- **73 human deaths** occurred earlier in the State but reported today.
- In all, **15,13,342 people** have been affected in **11 districts** in the State so far due to flood.

- **3239 villages** have been affected. **674 villages** have been marooned in the State.
- **27420 houses (2154 fully and 25266 partially)** have been damaged so far.
- About **5367 people** from the affected areas have been evacuated so far.
- **368 cattle/livestock** are reported to have been perished.
- **252 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected areas in which **10029 people** have been accommodated.
- **2047 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the affected areas.
- **116 mobile teams** of doctors along with medicines have been deployed in the flood affected areas for providing medical care.
- **775 cattle** have been treated and **70775 cattle** were vaccinated so far.
- **17** companies of **PAC** have been deployed with **184** motorized boats and **88** wooden boats in the affected areas for relief and rescue operations.
- **River Ghaghra and Ganga** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at **Elgin Bridge, Ayodhya, Turtipar and Balia** in the State.

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with isolated heavy falls has been reported in most parts of the State during **last 24 hours**. Areas where significant rainfall occurred are (in cm): **Dengraghat-12.0, Khagaria-9.0, Forbesganj-7.0, Araria-6.0 and Purnea-5.0**.
- **No human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- In all, about **6,14,000 people** from **802 villages** in **10 districts (Muzaffarpur, Supaul, Patna, Katihar, Nalanda, Araria, West Champaran, Shekhpura, Saharsa and Khagaria)** have been severally affected due to flood in the State.
- **1893 houses** are reported to have been damaged due to flood so far.
- **734 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **50911 persons** have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
- **05 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected area in which **2792** people have been accommodated.
- **River Ganga, Ghaghra, Burhi Gandak, Kosi, Mahananda and PunPun** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

- **No human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- **About 4.93 lakh people**, in all, are reported to have been affected in the State due to flood so far.
- **15,865 people** continued to be accommodated in **22 relief camps** in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **04 teams** of **NDRF** continued to be deployed in the State.
- River **Brahmaputra, Dhansiri (S) and Jiabharali** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

### **WEST BENGAL**

- **Light rainfall** has been reported in a few parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **02 human deaths** have been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.

- About **37.06 lakh people**, in all, are reported to have been affected in the State due to flood so far.
- **150 people** continued to be accommodated in **05 relief camps** in the State.
- **199 Medical teams** and **02 boats** continued to be deployed in the affected areas of the State.
- **398454 houses (238570 fully and 159984 partially)** are reported to have been damaged due to flood so far.
- **River Ganga** continued to be flowing above its danger level at **Farakka**.

#### **DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 18<sup>th</sup> AUGUST, 2008**

- ❖ In Assam, **02 teams** (about **80 personnel**) deployed one each at **Hailaikandi** and **Dhakuakhana** with **OBM** plus Boats assault universal type carrying out flood rescue operations. **02 teams** (about **80 personnel**) kept on standby at **BTC Dhemaji** and **Dhubri** for monsoon emergency response.
- ❖ In Jammu & Kashmir, **01 team** consisting of **45 personnel** continued to be deployed for **Amaranth Yatra**.
- ❖ In Uttaranchal, **01 team** consisting of **45 personnel** continued to be deployed for **Kailash Mansarovar Yatra** route at **Pithoragarh** district.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, **06<sup>th</sup> NDRF Bn** at **Arakanam** has been alerted to keep the **SAR** teams ready for move on short notice for rescue and relief operations.
- ❖ In Maharashtra, **02 teams** consisting of **64 personnel** have been deployed at **Chandrapur** and **Kolhapur** district for flood water rescue operation.

- The rainfall activity in the rest of the country is not significant.
