Subject: **SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2008: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT**

SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 28.08.2008

RAINFALL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

BIHAR

- **Light to moderate rainfall with isolated heavy falls** has been reported in a few parts of the State.
- **03 human deaths** have been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- **On 18.08.2008**, a long embankment was swept away at **Kushaha** in Nepal, about 7 km away from the Kosi Barrage at **Birpur** in **Supaul**, due to which **Supaul, Madhepura** and **Araria** districts have been affected severely.
- Due to above breach, river Kosi has reportedly changed its course and shifted over **120 km** eastwards. As a result, the large areas of **Supaul, Madhepura** and **Araria** are reported to have been inundated and affected severely.
- In **Supaul District**, about **8.93 lakh** people in **243 villages** have been badly affected.
- In **Madhepura District**, about **10.07 lakh** people in **378 villages** have been badly affected. **105 Panchayats** have been affected severely and **21 affected** partially.
- In **Araria District**, about **2.50 lakh** people in **13 villages** have been badly affected.
- In all, about **26,68,000 people** from **1598 villages** in **16 districts** have been affected due to flood.
- **2,27,969 houses** are reported to have been damaged.
- **1491 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **152603 persons** have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
- **In 155 relief camps** about **31,348** people have been accommodated.
- **In 59 cattle camps** about **716 animals** have been treated.
- **117 Health Centre** opened in the flood affected areas.

Relief assistance provided by Government of India

NDRF

- **10 teams of NDRF** (about **371** personnel) alongwith **56 boats** (10 men inflatable with Motor-40, Fiber glass speed boat-05 and 20 men boat-11)

deployed in **Supaul, Madhepura** and **Araria districts** for flood and relief duties.

- Another **03 teams** of **NDRF (11 personnel)** and **09 boats** airlifted **today** from **NDRF Bn Mundali (Bhuvaneshwar)** to **Purnia Air Base** with the help of five **AN-32 Air Force Aircraft**.
- Also **02 flood trained teams** of **NDRF (89 personnel)** are moving by road from **NDRF Bn Guwahati** to **Purnia**.
- **01 more team of 46 personnel** of **NDRF** with **04 boats (20 men)** of **NDRF Greater Noida** being airlifted to **Purnia Airbase** by **IL-76** of **Indian Air Force**.

- **One Army column** continued to be deployed in **Madhepura** for rescue and relief operations. **02 additional Army columns** have also been deployed in **Araria** and **Supaul** on **28th August, 2008**.
- **Two MI-8, two MI-17** and **one Chetak helicopter** positioned at **Purnea** and **two AN-32 aircraft** positioned at **Kalaikunda** for carrying out flood relief operations in the affected areas.
- **Two MI-8 helicopters** dropped **1.1 tones** relief material and airlifted **05 passengers** in **two sorties**. **Two MI-17 helicopters** dropped **3.3 tons** relief material and airlifted **01 passenger** in five sorties.
- In addition, **one AN-32 aircraft** airlifted **08 (3.2 tons)** boats and **22 passengers** **ex ITBP** to **Purnea**.
- **River Ghaghra** continued to be in **high flood situation** at **Gangpur Siswan** in **Siwan district** with **falling trend**.
- **River Ganga, Ghaghra, Burhi Gandhak, Bagmati, Kamla Balan, Kosi** and **Mahananda** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

Visit of Prime Minister

- **Hon'ble Prime Minister** and **Hon'ble Union Home Minister** visited the flood affected areas in the State today.

PUNJAB

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **No Human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- **11 districts** have been flooded and about **194675 people** from **849 villages** in above districts are reported to have been affected.
- **61 boats** and **45 medical teams** continued to be deployed in the flood affected areas
- **30 relief camps** still running in the flood affected areas.
- **6226 houses** and **90 huts** have been damaged so far.
- **86 cattle** and **15700 hens** have been perished.
- **4 cattle camps** opened in which about **1775 cattle** have been accommodated

UTTAR PRADESH

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- In all, **15,95,636 people** from **3798 villages** in **21 districts** have been affected severely and **674 villages** marooned in the State so far due to flood.
- **84,693 houses** have been damaged so far.
- **668 cattle/livestock** are reported to have been perished.
- **In 319 relief camps** about **11,269 people** have been accommodated.
- **3480 boats** and **178 mobile teams** of doctors along with medicines continued to be deployed in the flood affected areas.
- **17** companies of **PAC** have been deployed with **184** motorized boats and **88** wooden boats in the affected areas for relief and rescue operations.
- **River Ghaghra** continued to be in **high flood situation** at **Ayodhya** in rising trend.
- **River Ganga** and **Ghaghra** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at **Balia, Elgin Bridge** and **Turtipar** in the State.

- **About 7.92 lakh people**, in all, are reported to have been affected in the State.
- **20350 people** continued to be accommodated in **132 relief camps**.
- **01 teams** of **NDRF** with **OBM** plus boats assault universal type continued to be deployed in the State.
- River **Brahmaputra, Puthimari, Kushiara, Beki** and **Dhansiri (S)** continued to be flowing above their danger levels at various places in the State.

WEST BENGAL

- **16 human deaths** occurred previously in the State reported today.
- About **37.70 lakh people**, in all, are reported to have been affected in the State due to flood so far.

- **398919 houses** have been damaged due to flood so far.
- **River Ganga** continued to be flowing above its danger level at **Farakka**.

Human deaths

- As per provisional information received from the affected States/UTs, **21 human deaths (West Bengal-16, Bihar-03 and Assam-02)** were reported, raising the total death toll to **1622** from **1601**.

IMD

- The axis of monsoon trough passes through foothills of the Himalayas. **Yesterday's upper air cyclonic circulation over West Uttar Pradesh and neighbourhood persists.** Under the above scenario, **widespread rainfall activity with isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall** is likely over **Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Meghalaya, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal** and **Sikkim** during next **3-4 days**. **Fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy falls** also likely over **Bihar** during next **48 hours**.
- **Yesterday's cyclonic circulation over Tamil Nadu,** neighbourhood now lies over **north Tamil Nadu, adjoining South Interior Karnataka** and **Royalaseema** in lowers levels. Under its influence, **fairly widespread rainfall activity with isolated heavy falls** is likely over **Tamil Nadu, Kerala, south Karnataka** and **Royalaseema** during next **48 hours**.
- **Subdued rainfall activity** is likely to continue over the central parts of the country during next **2-3 days**.

There are **02 High, 22 Moderates** and **27 Low flood situation sites**.

- **Yesterday's cyclonic circulation over Tamil Nadu,** neighbourhood now lies over **north Tamil Nadu, adjoining South Interior Karnataka** and **Royalaseema** in lowers levels. Under its influence, **fairly widespread rainfall activity with isolated heavy falls** is likely over **Tamil Nadu, Kerala, south Karnataka** and **Royalaseema** during next **48 hours**.
- **Subdued rainfall activity** is likely to continue over the central parts of the country during next **2-3 days**.

Warning

- **Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall** is likely over **Assam, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal** and **Sikkim**.
- **Isolated heavy rainfall** is also likely over **Tamil Nadu, south Karnataka** and **Bihar**.

Outlook for next two days

- **Decrease in the intensity of rainfall activity** over **northeastern states, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Sikkim** and **Bihar**.

- **Fairly widespread rainfall** activity is likely along the **west coast**.

BIHAR

- **Light to moderate rainfall with isolated heavy falls** has been reported in a few parts of the State during **last 24 hours**.
- **03 human deaths** have been reported by the State during **last 24 hours**.
- **On 18.08.2008**, a long embankment was swept away at **Kushaha** in Nepal, about 7 km away from the Kosi Barrage at **Birpur** in **Supaul**, due to which **Supaul, Madhepura** and **Araria** districts have been affected severely.
- Due to above breach, river Kosi has reportedly changed its course and shifted over **120 km** eastwards. As a result, the large areas of **Supaul, Madhepura** and **Araria** are reported to have been inundated and affected severely.
- In **Supaul District**, about **8.93 lakh** people in **243 villages** have been badly affected.
 - Basantpur, Chhattapur, Pratapganj, Triveniganj and Raghovpur blocks are the worst affected blocks in the district. Electricity, Water supply and traffic movement in these blocks have totally been cut off.
 - Link road from Bhimnagar to Birpur has been washed away at four places.
 - Several people in Bela, Bodh, Banaili, Bishnapur and Birwa villages have still marooned.
 - Due to submergence of railway track in Raghovpur, the train movement from Araria to Raghovpur has been suspended.

- 19 relief camps have been opened in the district in which several people have been accommodated.
 - 195 local boats and 12 motor boats have been pressed into service for relief and rescue operations.
 - About 50,000 people have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
 - 22,367 Kachha, 2233 pacca houses and 1.98 lakh juggis have been damaged so far.
 - 13550 cattle have been affected so far. 20 animal camps have been established in which about 538 animals have been treated.
 - About 1.14 lakh ha area has been damaged in the State so far.
 - 14926 food packets and 13,700 polythene sheets have been distributed in the affected areas. 11,710 food packets have also been air-dropped.
- In **Madhepura District**, about **10.07 lakh** people in **378 villages** have been badly affected. **105 Panchayats** have been affected severely and **21 affected** partially.
 - About 11 blocks in the district have been partly submerged. The worst affected areas are Alamnagar, Uda Kishanganj, Kumarkhand, Gwalpada, Bihariganj, Purani, Chawsha, Shanker, Sindgheshwar, Gamaria, Bhellur and Murliganj. About 3 to 8 feet water has been reported in above affected areas.
 - 97 boats have been pressed into service for relief and rescue operations.
 - 40 Relief Camps have been opened in the affected areas of the State in which about 22,126 people have taken shelter.
 - More than 50,000 people have been evacuated so far from the affected areas.
 - Chura-381 Q, Gur-80 Q, Sattu-50 Q and Polythene Sheets-60584 have been distributed in the affected areas so far.
 - Railway track at Dinapatti between Saharsa – Purnea has been submerged under water. As a result, the rail movement on this section has been suspended.
 - Vehicular movement on National Highway between Kumarghat-Murlighat has also been suspended due to submergence of water.
- In **Araria District**, about **2.50 lakh** people in **13 villages** have been badly affected.
 - The worst affected areas in the district are **Farbishganj, Raniganj, Bhairgaon** and **Narpatganj**.
 - 15 Relief camps have been opened in the State in which about 15,000 people have been accommodated.

- ❖ In addition, **one AN-32 aircraft** airlifted **08 (3.2 tons)** boats and **22** passengers **ex ITBP** to **Purnea**.
- ❖ A total of **7.6** tons of relief material was dropped and **28** passengers airlifted in **12** sorties in **Purnea and Birpur** districts.

RAINFALL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY DURING LAST 24 HOURS

- **Light to moderate rainfall** with **isolated heavy falls** has been reported in a few parts of **Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Karnataka, Sikkim,**

Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal and in some parts of **Northeastern states**.

- The rainfall activity in the rest of the country is not significant.
