Subject: **SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2008: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT**

SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 18.09.2008

RAINFALL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

GUJARAT

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **isolated extremely heavy falls** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- About **17.59 lakh people in 12 districts** and in **56 villages** have been affected due to flood so far.
- About **240 cattle** livestock have been perished so far.
- **55 relief camps** are running in the affected districts of the State in which about **13,126 people** have been accommodated.
- **47 State** and **265 Panchayat** roads are reportedly damaged due to heavy rainfall in the State. The traffic movements on these roads have been disrupted.
- **6057 feeders, 554 transformers** and **4092 electricity poles** in **12690 villages** have been damaged.
- **330 medical teams** consisting of **136 medical officers** and **1035 paramedical staff** have been deployed in the affected areas.
- Traffic and rail movement has also been disrupted in **Saurashtra Region**.

ORISSA

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **isolated extremely heavy falls** has been reported in the State.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- Due to **deep depression** over **Costal Orissa**, **extremely heavy rainfall accompanied with squally winds** has been reported in **several coastal districts** of the State.
- As a result, several villages in the districts of **Puri, Boudh, Nayagarh, Kattak, Kendrapara, Jajpur, Kolahandi, Bolangir** and **Jagatpur** are reported to have been inundated and affected severally.
- **River Baitarni** and **Vamsadhara** are flowing above danger level at various places in the state.

ANDHRA PRADESH

- **Due to depression** over **North West Bay of Bengal**, there has been a widespread rainfall in catchment areas of **Nagavali** and **Vamsadhara rivers**. As a result, **Nagavali, Vamsadhara** are receiving heavy inflows of water.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- Water entered into **10 villages** in **04 mandals** in **Srikakulam districts** which are adjacent to **Vamsadhara River**.
- **01 relief camp** is running at **Kuntibadra** village of **Kothur mandal** in which about **56 families** have been shifted.
- Agriculture crops in **Kothur** and **Bamini Mandal** got inundated.

BIHAR

- **Light to moderate rainfall with isolated heavy falls** has been reported in some parts of the State.
- About **43,94,000 people** from **2463 villages** in **17 districts** have been affected due to flood in the State.
- **No human death** has been reported by the State today. The total human death toll of the State is **208**.
- **229 cattle livestock** have been perished so far.
- **3,19,569 houses** are reported to have been damaged due to flood so far.
- **3521 boats** have been pressed into service for rescue and relief operations in the flood affected areas of the State.
- **1028245 persons** have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
- **In 359 relief camps** about **3,53,991** people have been accommodated.
- **In 161 cattle camps** about **54230 animals** accommodated.
- **177 medical teams** have been deployed in the affected areas of the State.
- **409 Health Centre** have also been opened in the flood affected areas of the State for providing medical care.

UTTAR PRADESH

- **No significant rainfall** has been reported in the State.
- **01 human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- About **25,83,942 people** from **4,735 villages** in **23 districts** have been affected severely and **732 villages** marooned in the State so far due to flood.
- **About 2,69,683 houses** have been damaged so far.
- About **57,376 people** from the affected areas have been evacuated so far.
- **3477 cattle/livestock** are reported to have been perished.
- **4.15 lakh ha** areas have been damaged.
- **441 relief camps** have been opened in the flood affected areas in which **48133 people** have been accommodated.
- **4,322 boats** and **183 mobile teams** of doctors along with medicines continued to be deployed in the flood affected areas.

WEST BENGAL

- **No significant rainfall** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**.
- Due to deep depression, extremely heavy rainfall accompanied with squally winds has been reported in a few coastal districts of the State on 16th & 17th September, 2008. As a result, several villages in the districts of **Poorva Medinipur, South 24 Pargana** and **North 24 Pargana** are reported to have been affected severally.
 - About 60,000 people have been affected in these districts.
 - About 7,000 people have been evacuated to the safer places.
- **01 human death** has been reported by the State during last **24 hours**.
- About **38.71 lakh people** have been affected in the State due to flood so far.
- **119858 ha** cropped areas has been damaged.
- **3923 cattle livestock** have been perished so far.
- About **5994 people** have been evacuated to the safer places.
- **In 31 relief centres** about **5,994 people** have been accommodated.
- **416360 houses** have been damaged due to flood so far.

ASSAM

- **Light to moderate rainfall** has been reported in a few parts of the State.
- **No human death** has been reported by the State during last 24 hours.
- **About 20.00 lakh people** have been affected in **21 districts** and **1524 villages** in the State due to flood so far.
- **32067 people** continued to be accommodated in **178 relief camps**.

- **85** boats continued to be deployed in the State for relief and rescue operations.

Advisory issued by MHA

- On receipt of information from IMD, an advisory has been issued by MHA to the State of **Orissa, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana/Chandigarh, Delhi, Uttarakhand** and **Railway** for taking appropriate precautionary measures in view of the **depression over north Chhattisgarh** due to which **heavy to very heavy falls** with **extremely heavy falls** is likely over above States.

Human deaths

- As per provisional information received from the affected States/UTs, **21 human deaths** were reported, raising the total death toll to **2203 to 2182**.

INDIA METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT

- The **deep depression over north Orissa** remained practically stationary and lay centered at 1730 hrs IST of **17th September, 2008** over the same area **near Jharsuguda**. The system is likely to move in a **northwesterly direction** and **weaken gradually**.
- Under its influence, **rainfall at most places** with **heavy to very heavy falls** at few places and **extremely heavy falls (> 25 cm)** at isolated places is likely over **Orissa** during next **24 hours** and **Chhattisgarh** during next **48 hours**. **Rainfall at many places** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is likely over **north coastal Andhra Pradesh** and **Gangetic West Bengal** during next **24 hours** and over **Jharkhand** and **east Madhya Pradesh** during next **48 hours**.
- The Other **upper air cyclonic circulation** over **Gujarat state** persists and extends upto mid tropospheric level. Under its influence, **fairly widespread rainfall activity** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is likely over **North Konkan and Gujarat state** during next **48 hours** & **decrease thereafter**.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION

- There are **01 Moderates** and **05 Low flood situation sites**.

INDIA METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT

Chief features

- The **deep depression over north Orissa** remained practically stationary and lay centered at 1730 hrs IST of **17th September, 2008** over the same area **near Jharsuguda**. The system is likely to move in a **northwesterly direction** and **weaken gradually**.
- Under its influence, **rainfall at most places** with **heavy to very heavy falls** at few places and **extremely heavy falls (> 25 cm)** at isolated places is likely over **Orissa** during next **24 hours** and **Chhattisgarh** during next **48 hours**. **Rainfall at many places** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is likely over **north coastal Andhra Pradesh** and **Gangetic West Bengal** during next **24 hours** and over **Jharkhand** and **east Madhya Pradesh** during next **48 hours**.
- The Other **upper air cyclonic circulation** over **Gujarat state** persists and extends upto mid tropospheric level. Under its influence, **fairly widespread rainfall activity** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is likely over **North Konkan and Gujarat state** during next **48 hours** & **decrease thereafter**.

Warning

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** at few places with **isolated extremely heavy fall (> 25 cm)** are likely over **Orissa** during next **24 hours** and over **Chhattisgarh** during next **48 hours**.

- **Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall** is likely over **North coastal Andhra Pradesh, Gangetic west Bengal** during next **24 hours** and **Jharkhand, East Madhya Pradesh** and **North Telangana** during next **48 hours**.

Outlook for next two days

- Enhanced in rainfall activity is likely over **North West India, outside of Jammu & Kashmir** and decrease over **East India**.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION

Assam

- **River Brahmaputra** at **Dibrugarh** is flowing at **104.82m** against the **danger level** of **104.24m** with a **steady trend**.

Orissa

- **River Baitarni** at **Anandpur** is flowing at **38.55m** against the **danger level** of **38.36m** with a **rising trend**.
- **River Baitarni** at **Akhpada** is flowing at **18.70m** against the **danger level** of **17.38m** with a **steady trend**.
- **River Vamsadhara** at **Gunupur** is flowing at **84.10m** against the **danger level** of **83.00m** with a **falling trend**.
- **River Vamsadhara** at **Kashinagar** is flowing at **56.15m** against the **danger level** of **54.60m** with a **falling trend**

Detailed situation

GUJARAT

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall with isolated extremely heavy falls** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**. Areas where significant rainfall is reported (in cm) : **Dhandhuka-50.4, Lakhtar-47.8, Sayla-37.2, Limbdi-30.2, Ranpur-26.5, Dhrangadhra-25.8, Sojitra-24.5, Wadhvan-23.4, Chuda & Tarapur-22.7** each, **Muli-20.0, Petlad-19.1, Dasada-18.0, Detroj-15.5, Viramgam-15.3, Barvala-13.4, Anklav-15.0** and **Halvad-12.9**.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
 - **In Surinder Nagar district**, a breach in Narmada canal at Tavi in Taluka Lakhtar has been reported due to which the canal water has entered into several low lying areas and several villages has been inundated.
 - About **39,646 people** from **19 villages** have been severally affected in the district so far.
 - About **5271 people** have been evacuated to the safer places. **21 relief camps** are opened.
 - **09 boats** have been pressed into service in the district for rescue and relief operations.
 - Traffic movement on **Surender nagar-Ahmedabad** highway is disrupted as a stretch of the highway has been submerged under water.
- About **17.59 lakh people in 12 districts** and in **56 villages** have been affected due to flood so far.
- About **240 cattle** livestock have been perished so far.
- **55 relief camps** are running in the affected districts of the State in which about **13,126 people** have been accommodated.

- **47 State** and **265 Panchayat** roads are reportedly damaged due to heavy rainfall in the State. The traffic movements on these roads have been disrupted.
- **6057 feeders, 554 transformers** and **4092 electricity poles** in **12690 villages** have been damaged.
- **330 medical teams** consisting of **136 medical officers** and **1035 paramedical staff** have been deployed in the affected areas.
- Traffic and rail movement has also been disrupted in **Saurashtra Region**.

ORISSA

- **Heavy to very heavy rainfall with isolated extremely heavy falls** has been reported in the State during last **24 hours**. Areas where significant rainfall reported (in cm): **Patnagarh-27.0, Kantamal-26.0, Tiltagarh-25.0, Rairakhol-24.0, Kotagarh-23.0, Sambalpur-22.0, Bolangir, Madanpur & Rampur-20.0** each, **Hirkud, Jharsuguda, Lalkera, Baliguda-19.0** each, **Tikabali-18.0, Kuchinda, Rajkishore Nagar, Junagarh-17.0** each, **Sonepur-16.0, Deogarh, Jamnkira, Lanjigarh-14.0** each, **Nakiduel, Reamal, Pallahara, Ambabhona, Bhawanipatna, Dunguripali-13** each, **Jaipatna-12.0, Athmalick Daringibadi, Kotraguda-11.0** each, **Telkoi-10.0, Chhendi pada, Rengali, Binika, Kalinga-9.0** each and **Harbhanga, Nawarangpur, Bisam, Cuttack & Gudwari-7.0** each.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- Due to **deep depression over Costal Orissa, extremely heavy rainfall accompanied with squally winds** has been reported in **several coastal districts** of the State.
- As a result, several villages in the districts of **Puri, Boudh, Nayagarh, Kattak, Kendrapara, Jajpur, Kolahandi, Bolangir** and **Jagatpur** are reported to have been inundated and affected severally.
- **River Baitarni** and **Vamsadhara** are flowing above danger level at various places in the state.

ANDHRA PRADESH

- **Due to depression over North West Bay of Bengal**, there has been a widespread rainfall in catchment areas of **Nagavali** and **Vamsadhara rivers**. As a result, **Nagavali, Vamsadhara** are receiving heavy inflows of water.
- **No human death** has been reported in the State during **last 24 hours**.
- Water entered into **10 villages** in **04 mandals** in **Srikakulam districts** which are adjacent to **Vamsadhara River**.
- **01 relief camp** is running at **Kuntibadra** village of **Kothur mandal** in which about **56 families** have been shifted.
- Agriculture crops in **Kothur** and **Bamini Mandal** got inundated.

BIHAR

- **Light to moderate rainfall with isolated heavy falls** has been reported in some parts of the State during last **24 hours**.
- **On 18.08.2008**, a long embankment was swept away at **Kushaha** in Nepal, about **7 km away** from the Kosi Barrage at **Birpur** in **Supaul**.
- Due to above breach, **river Kosi** has changed its course and shifted over **120 km eastwards**. As a result, large areas of **Supaul, Madhepura, Katihar, Saharsa** and **Araria** have been flooded/inundated and affected severely.
- In **Supaul District**, about **8,93,790** people in **243 villages** and **73 Panchayats (68 fully & 5 partially)** have been badly affected.

- **Basantpur, Chhattapur, Pratapganj, Triveniganj and Raghapur** are the worst affected blocks in the district.
- **46** relief camps are opened in the district in which about **62,888** people have been accommodated.
- **497** local boats, 01 government boat and 32 motor boats have been pressed into service for relief and rescue operations.
- About **3,70,000** people have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
- **22,367** Kachha, **2233** pacca houses and 1,98,846 juggis have been damaged so far.
- **20** cattle camps established in the district in which about **9,152** cattle accommodated and **5956** cattle were given treatment.
- About **77,107** ha agricultural land has been damaged in the State so far.
- In **Madhepura District**, about **11.55 lakh** people in **378 villages** have been badly affected. **130 Panchayats** have been affected severely.
 - About 11 blocks in the district have been partly submerged. The worst affected areas are **Alamnagar, Uda Kishanganj, Kumarkhand, Gwalpada, Bihariganj, Purani, Chawsha, Shankerpur, Sindgheshwar, Madhepura and Murliganj.**
 - Flood water has been reported to be receding from the affected areas.
 - **418** boats have been pressed into service for relief and rescue operations.
 - **74** Relief Camps have been opened in the affected areas in which about **56,000** people have taken shelter.
 - More than **3,35,110** people have been evacuated so far from the affected areas.
 - **30** cattle camps opened in which about **6061** cattle were given treatment.
 - **34** medical camps and **55** mobile medical teams have also been in service in the affected areas.
- In **Araria District**, about **3,91,328** people in **04 blocks** and in **98 villages** have been badly affected.
 - The worst affected areas in the district are **Forbishganj, Raniganj, Bhaigama and Narpatganj.**
 - **65** Relief camps have been opened in the district in which about **81,439** people have been accommodated.
 - **89** boats and **81** motor boats are pressed into service for relief and rescue operations.
 - **28311** people have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.
 - **15** cattle camps and **46** medical camps have also been established in the affected areas in which about **58,583** persons were given treatment.
 - **37,220** ha agricultural land and **5732** ha non agricultural land are reported to be affected in the district.
- In **Saharsa District**, about **4,31,089 lakh** people in **06 Blocks, 57 Panchayats** and **145 villages** have been badly affected.
 - The worst affected Panchayats are **Patanghal, Saurabazar and Sonbarsa.**
 - **83** relief camps opened in the district in which **40,613** people have been accommodated.
 - **310** Govt. boat and **27** motor boats have been pressed into service for relief and rescue operations.

- About **1,15,945** people have been evacuated from the affected areas so far.

- **85 boats** continued to be deployed in the State for relief and rescue operations.
- **33,704** People have been evacuated from the affected areas and shifted to safer places.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 15th SEPTEMBER, 2008 (deployment since 15th onwards not received)

Bihar

- Total **19 teams** of NDRF (**789 personnel** including **11 Officers**) alongwith **158 boats (104 inflatable, 19 BAUTs & 35 country boats/rafts)** continued to be deployed in **Supaul, Madhepura, Araria and Purnia** for flood rescue and relief duties.
- BSF/ITBP (NDRF) Medical Teams led by three Medical Officers remained engaged in providing medical aids to **110 patients** by establishing Medical Camps at respective places in area **Banmankhi block (Distt Purnia)** on **11th Sep 2008**.

Assam

- **05 teams** (about **190 personnel**) deployed at **Hailakandi, Kendukona, Dakuakhana, Golakganj and Simon Chapori** along with **07 motorized boats** (Inflatable -03 and BAUT -04) for flood rescue operation.

- **Light to moderate rainfall** with **isolated heavy falls** has been reported in a few parts of **Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chandigarh, Delhi, Goa, Gujarat, Jharkhand, Konkan, Maharashtra, Orissa, West Bengal** and in some parts of **Northeastern States**.
- The rainfall activity in the rest of the country is not significant.
