b. Significant Weather Features:

- **A low pressure Area is likely to form over North Bay of Bengal by tomorrow, the 04th august 2020.**
- As a result, the monsoon trough which is presently in the near normal position is likely to become active during next 3-4 days.
- The lower level southwesterly/westerly winds have strengthened over the Arabian Sea and over southern parts of Bay of Bengal and Andaman Sea.
- Under the above favourable scenario, Monsoon will enter to active phase over the Central and Peninsular India from 4 th August onwards for subsequent 3-4 days.
