b. Significant Weather Features:

- The low pressure area over northeast Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood is very likely to move northwestwards and merge with the monsoon trough during next 48 hours.
- Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places very likely over major parts of northwest India (Western Himalayan region, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and East Rajasthan) during 10th-12th August.
- (ii) Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places are also very likely over parts of Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat region during 10th-14th August with likely further enhancement of rainfall intensity over north Gujarat and southwest Madhya Pradesh on 13th & 14th August.

4. Other Incident-

(i) Landslide in Kerala: Landslide occurred in Tata tea Company Pettimudi Munnar Kerala. 49 persons have been reported dead, 12 persons got injured and approx 21 persons are still missing. Search and Rescue operation continue by NDRF, Fire, Forest, Police, Emergency Response Team and Local Administration.

(ii) Landslide at Karnataka Update: Landslides incidents occurred on 06.08.2020 in Karnataka- Bhramagiri hills, Bhagamandala, Madikeri Taluk. Search and rescue operation continues in Bramgiri Hills, Tala Cauvery, 04 people are missing.
