Isolated heavy to very heavy falls also very likely over Telangana and North Interior Karnataka on today, 17th Sept, 2020.
- Under the influence of likely formation of a Low Pressure Area over Northeast Bay of Bengal and consequent strengthening of lower level winds along the West Coast; Fairly widespread to widespread rainfall with Isolated heavy to very heavy falls likely over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Odisha, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Konkan & Goa, Karnataka and Kerala during 19th-21th September, 2020.
- Moderate thunderstorm with lightning very likely at isolated places over southeast Rajasthan, East Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, West Bengal & Sikkim, Gujarat Region, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Telangana and North Interior Karnataka during next 12 hours.
