Significant Weather Features:

- The Well Marked Low Pressure Area lies over East Madhya Pradesh & neighbourhood. It is very likely to move west-northwestwards across north Madhya Pradesh and south Uttar Pradesh during next 2 days and weaken gradually. The Monsoon Trough at mean sea level lies its near normal position.
- In addition, the convergence of strong lower level southwesterly winds from Arabian Sea and easterly winds from Bay of Bengal is very likely over the plains of Northwest India during next 2-3 days.
- Under the influence of the above systems: a) Widespread rainfall with heavy to very heavy falls likely over Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha and Konkan & Goa on 28th & 29th August; over Chhattisgarh on 28th August, 2020; over Gujarat state on 28th, 29th & 30th August. Isolated Extremely Heavy falls are very likely over Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha on today, the 28th August, 2020. b) Fairly widespread rainfall with Isolated heavy falls and thunderstorm & lightning very likely over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi and West Uttar Pradesh on today, the 28th August, 2020. Fairly widespread rainfall with Isolated heavy falls and thunderstorm & lightning also very likely over Rajasthan during 29th August to 01st September, 2020.
- Moderate thunderstorm accompanied with lightning at isolated places very likely over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, West Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha during next 12 hours.

4. Other Incident-

Landslide in Kerala Update: Landslide occurred on 07.08.2020 in Tata tea Company Pettimudi, Munnar, Kerala. 65 persons have been reported dead, 12 persons got injured and 05 persons are still missing. The first stage of searching has put to an end by the authorities because of the search of the fifth consecutive day goes in vain. Searching operation for the five missing persons will be resumed when the water level of the river will become normal.
