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**Situation report on Flood/Heavy Rain fall as on 13<sup>th</sup>September, 2019 at 1800 Hrs.**

**1. Forecast**

**i. IMD**

- **13 September (Day 1):** ♦ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** with **extremely heavy falls** very likely to occur at isolated places over Gujarat region and West Madhya Pradesh; **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** at isolated places over East Rajasthan, SubHimalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam & Meghalaya and Konkan & Goa; **Heavy Rainfall** at isolated places over Uttarakhand, East Uttar Pradesh, East Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Kerala and Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal.
- **14 September (Day 2):** ♦ **Heavy to very heavy rainfall** very likely to occur at isolated places over West Madhya Pradesh; **Heavy Rainfall** at isolated places over Uttarakhand, East Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Gujarat region, Madhya Maharashtra, Konkan & Goa and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- **15 September (Day 3):** ♦ **Heavy rainfall** very likely at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, SubHimalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam & Meghalaya and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

**ii. CWC**

- **RED ALERT:**
  - River Chambal in Kota district of **Rajasthan** continues to flowing in **EXTREME FLOOD SITUATION** at 17:00 hrs today. At 17:00 hrs, it was flowing at a level of 218.18 m with **Rising** trend which is 0.50 m above its previous HFL of 217.68 m.
- **ORANGE WARNING:**
  - In **Assam** rivers Jiabharali and Brahmaputra, in **Bihar** rivers Bagmati and Kosi, in **Gujarat** river Narmada, in **Rajasthan** river Chambal are flowing in **SEVERE FLOOD SITUATION** with Steady trend (above danger level) but below HFL except river Jiabharali in **Assam**, river Bagmati in **Bihar**, river Narmada in **Gujarat** and river Chambal in **Rajasthan** where rising trend have been observed.

The above SDRF/NDRF release includes the additional central assistance from NDRF of Rs. 3338.22 crore to Odisha , Rs 1029.39 crore to Karnataka and Rs 64.49 crore to Himachal Pradesh, recently approved by HLC on 19<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

5. **Meeting of National Crisis Management Committee (NCMC): -**

Cabinet Secretary on 08.08.2019 took stock of the flood situation, preparedness, rescue and relief operations and directed that immediate assistance, as sought by the states, be provided to meet the crisis. Senior officials of the Ministries of Home, Defence, Water Resources as well as those from NDRF, NDMA and Central Water Commission attended the meeting. Chief Secretaries and other senior officers from the State Governments participated in the meeting through Video Conference. As decided in the meeting, following actions have been taken:

- Additional resources from NDRF, Army, Navy, Air Forces and Indian Coast Guard in affected state as per the requirement of States concerned.
- Fund from the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) has been released.
- MHA has issued letter to DFS and M/o Agriculture to undertake work relating to crop insurance claims.

**NCMC Meeting dated 20.08.2019**

A meeting of National Crises Management Committee was held on 20.08.2019 to review the prevailing flood situation in the states of Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Uttarakhand, Haryana and Delhi. Cabinet Secretary took stock of the current situation, preparedness, and rescue & relief operations and directed that immediate assistance, as sought by the states, be provided to meet the crisis. It was also directed to make available necessary financial assistance from the State Disaster Response Fund to the affected states.

6. **Meeting to review the flood situation in the country held in MHA**

On the direction of Hon'ble Home Minister, Minister of State (Home) took a meeting on 09.08.2019 to review and take stock of the flood situation of affected state and rescue and relief operations being carried out by NDRF, Army, Air Force, Navy and ICG.

**7. Union Home Minister reviewed the Flood Situation in Karnataka and Maharashtra by undertaking an Aerial Survey**

Union Home Minister, Shri Amit Shah undertook an aerial survey of flood affected areas of Belgavi district of Karnataka and Sangli & Kolhapur of Maharashtra on 11.08.2019.

He was accompanied by the CM, Karnataka, Shri B.S. Yediyurappa, Union Minister for Parliamentary Affairs, Coal and Mines, Shri Prahlad Joshi, Minister of State for Railways, Shri Suresh Angadi, Member of Parliament, Shri Prabhakar Kore, Local MLA, MLC and officers of the State Government.

Thereafter, the Home Minister held a meeting at the Belagavi Aiport to review the flood situation in the Karnataka State. A presentation was made by the state government officers depicting the extent of damage and the rescue measures taken, including the NDRF teams deployed.

**8. Steps taken by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare:**

- Provided essential medicines and medical consumables (approx. 77 MT) of Rs 4.42 crores to the State Government of Kerala.
- Provided emergency medicines and consumable (40 items) of Rs 6.60 crore to Karnataka.

**9. Constitution of Inter Ministerial Center Team.**

Ministry of Home Affairs has constituted Inter Ministerial Central Teams (IMCTs) for the States of Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Karnataka and Kerala affected by recent floods to have first hand on-the-spot assessment of damages caused and relief work carried out by the State administration.

IMCT for state of Assam, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Bihar, Rajasthan, Meghalaya & Tripura has carried out the spot assessment of the damages of affected states.

**10. Preliminary Note on Heavy Rainfall in Madhya Pradesh in Ratlam District and adjoin area.**

- A small dam, Kundanpur Dam in Ratlam District (Madhya Pradesh) reached Full Tank Level and due to heavy rains occurring in the catchment areas, the dam may either overflow or suspected to be broken.
- Due to very heavy rain, Mahi Bajaj Sagar in Banswara District, Rajasthan is getting heavy inflows and as the Dam is near Full Reservoir Level (FRL), that water is being released downstream. Mahi Bajaj Sagar is expected to get around 5,000 cumec inflow by night tonight. Kadana Dam in the downstream in Mahisagar District of Gujarat is getting an inflow of around 6,000 cumec and is likely to increase.
- However, the overflow from Kundanpur Dam may affect areas nearby the dam to atleast around 2 to 5 km downstream of the dam in case of breach. All nearby habitations have to be moved to safer higher locations in case of breach/overflow from the dam.
